TOWN OF GRANTHAM

Ordinance Regulating Heavy Hauling Over Town Highways - No.H-1

Pursuant to the authority conferred by New Hampshire Revised Statutes Annotated Chapter 41 Sec. 11, in order to promote the general welfare of the citizens of the Town of Grantham, the following ordinance is hereby enacted:

Section 1: Limitation on Hauling:

From and after the effective date of this ordinance, it shall be unlawful for any person, partnership or corporation to haul, transport or cause to be transported by vehicle with gross weight over six (6) tons any material over the Class V roads, when posted, as described in Section 5 from March 1 to April 30 each year except as allowed by special permit or exception in Section 2 and Section 3.

Section 2: Special Permits:

The Road Agent may issue a special permit for the operation of vehicles weighing more than six (6) tons from March 1 to April 30, when the roads are posted, if he determines that the vehicle will not cause unusual damage to the highway. Such permit may limit the time and duration of hauling and the weight hauled.

Section 3: Exceptions:

The provisions of this ordinance shall not apply to:

- 1) Emergency vehicles and any motor vehicle operated by or for the Town.
- 2) Delivery vehicles making occasional trips to service residences.
- 3) Any vehicles issued a special permit under Section 2.

Section 4: Penalty:

Whoever shall fail to comply with the provisions of this ordinance shall be guilty of a violation and subject to a fine of one hundred dollars (\$100.00). For the purposes of this ordinance, each load hauled over the roads listed in Section 5 shall be deemed a separate occurrence.



Section 5: Roads covered in this ordinance:

All Class V roads in the Town of Grantham except Yankee Barn Road.

Section 6: Effective Date:

This ordinance shall be effective upon adoption by the Board of Selectmen and upon recording of a copy of the same with the Grantham Town Clerk.
